About the Program

Austin Health offers you an opportunity to be involved in a program of education for a period of 12 months to facilitate your orientation into the Australian Healthcare system. This program includes a six-week Supervised Observership Placement fully structured and followed by an intensive feedback session with our dedicated IMG clinical educator. You will also be given access to a wide variety of education and learning opportunities.

ESSENTIAL CRITERIA

- Australian Citizenship or Permanent Resident
- Passed Australian Medical Council MCQ Examination (Part 1)
- IELTS Test Pass (Average of 7 or above overall) or OET Pass (B or above in each category) that is less than two years old
- Primary Medical Degree completed less than ten years ago
- Internship completed in country of study

DESIRED CRITERIA

- Passed Australian Medical Council Clinical Examination (Part 2)
- Completed a minimum of 12 weeks of full time equivalent work over the last 3 years
- Previously practiced medicine for more than 2 years

FURTHER DETAILS

The 6 week Observership placement entails:

• Possible units include: Emergency Department, General Surgery, Aged Care, and General Medicine (including admitting, perioperative, wards and covering time)

HOW TO APPLY

As there are limited places and substantial interest in this program we have a number of criteria that Austin Health requires to be met before considering the application.



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TERMS AND CONDITIONS

The IMG Training Program will be for a period of 12 months and includes a 6-week Observership Program which may cover a rotation through: Emergency, General Surgical, Aged Care and General Medicine (including admitting, perioperative, wards and covering time)

- The IMG Training Program includes access to a wide variety of education (IMG monthly workshops, annual IMG study day, hospital grand rounds, access to Austin Health Sciences Library, weekly intern, emergency, HMO education, GP education, Psych education, Research fest and careers evening invite).
- Successful applicants will be notified early May 2022.
- A formal offer will be made and if accepted must be signed and returned within 5 working days
- There will be an opportunity to place preferences for Observership dates and units but this cannot be guaranteed and will be determined in accordance with hospital workflow.

Condition of Payment

- Payment of \$2800 (inc GST) must be made within 30 days of the invoice being issued
- If payment is not made within 30 days, the offer will be withdrawn and become void
- Refunds will not be given once the applicant has accepted the formal offer
- Successful applicants will be required to attend a compulsory orientation session and BLS workshop on Thursday 26th May, 2022
- Austin Health Name ID badges will be issued with the title 'Honorary Clinical Observer' and must always be strictly worn when on the Austin Health Campus
- A certificate of completion will be issued upon successful completion of your 6-week Observership and 12-month Education Training Program The 12-month Training Program does not continue onto or guarantee employment at Austin Health after completion.
- COVID-19: should infection control restrictions change, Observerships may be delayed or cancelled.
